1. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

Since its creation in 1999, CAMYOSFOP has been working on upholding a non-violent society through moral and traditional values as prerequisite to a culture of peace by implementing activities in line with her programs which are geared towards capacity strengthening and empowerment of the youths, women/girls and the most vulnerable in communities. In 2023, the Organization designed activities within the framework of her programs which were successfully implemented despite the challenges faced with the insecurity crisis in the Anglophone regions, the Northern and Eastern regions of Cameroon.

1.1. INTERNAL ORGANIZATION

A board meeting was held on April, 5th 2023 where the Board members evaluated the Organisation's performance in 2021 and 2022, discussed on the strategic action plan and took important decisions concerning most especially the, creation of CAMYOSFOP's Radio, organization of the Partners' Dinner, celebration of the 37th Anniversary of the passing away of Prof. Bernard Fonlon, setting –up of Bertoua and Buea regional offices, organization of the 2nd edition of the course on DACPD, project on providing financial support to ID Women/girls, as well as, Staff capacity building during a Staff retreat.

1.2. Based on the decisions from the board meeting, a staff retreat held from June 15th -17th 2023, under the theme '*Redynamising Current Organizational Strength for a Sustainable Partnership Engagement*' at Holiday Inn Resort Limbe, was organized where staff performance was evaluated and their technical capacity strengthened on resource mobilization and fundraising, project writing during a session facilitated by Mrs Esther Omam (Executive Director of Reach out Development) as well as experience sharing on the prevention of GBV in a Humanitarian context by Mr Melvin Songwe (Programs Officer UYO) and Mr Chongsi Joseph (Executive Director of CHRAPA).



The retreat was also an opportunity for staff to strategize on the UN Women (JSB) Project on ‘Building protection capacities of IDP women and girls hosted in 5 Municipalities of the West, Littoral and Centre Regions’, after which concrete commitments and recommendations were adopted.

2. IMPLEMENTATION OF ACTIVITIES

2.1. ARMS CONTROL PROGRAM

2.1.1. SELF-IMPLEMENTED ACTIVITIES

2.1.1. a. The 2nd edition of the Certified Course on Diplomacy of Arms Control, Proliferation and Disarmament (DACPD).

CAMYOSFOP organized the second edition of the Certified Course on the Diplomacy of Arms Control, Non-proliferation and Disarmament from the 4th to the 22nd of September 2023 in partnership with IRIC, RECSA, UNREC, ECOSOCC and the Trans-Atlantic Consulting. Under the theme: ‘Mainstreaming Gender in the Control of Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW) in Africa’, the program of this annual Certified Course brought together 32 participants from MINDEF, MINAT, MINREX, MINJUSTICE, SED, EIFORCES, NCDDR, UNDP, as well as the Directorate General of Customs, 01 International participant from Burundi without leaving out Civil Society Organizations.

2.1.1. b. Campaign on the fight against war toys, video games, violent films and drug abuse

CAMYOSFOP Bertoua Office organized a sensitization campaign on the fight against war toys, video games, violent films and the use of drugs at College Adventiste and College Islamique Amour in Bertoua, on December 8th , 2023. Through the campaign, about 500 students, teachers and parents were sensitized on the negative impact these toys, games, films and drugs have on children, thus accounting for the increase in the rate of violence which is being witnessed in recent times, especially within the school milieu.

2.1.2. COLLABORATION WITH PARTNERS

As a multi-functional hub, CAMYOSFOP does not work alone, and collaborates with multi-functional partners operating in various domains of promotion of peace, development and social co-existence with some partners like, UN Women, UNODA, UNDP, UNSCAR, UNREC, AFRICAN UNION and ICAN.

It is important to recognize the role of the Economic Community of Central African States (ECCAS) and MINREX for their support in facilitating the organization of all the Sub-Regional meetings.

2.1.2. a UN WOMEN SALIENT project on: Mainstreaming Gender in the Control of Small Arms and Light Weapons in Cameroon.

40 Staff members from Development Organizations/ UN Agencies which included; UNDP, UN Women as well as key Government Institutions and the Civil Society acquired knowledge on mainstreaming gender in arms control programs and policies. In effect, this training gave UN Women the opportunity to position herself as a key stakeholder in promoting reforms on gender mainstreaming in Arms Control policies.



2.12. b CAMYOSFOP/UNDP/UNSCAR COLLABORATION ON THE FIGHT AGAINST SALW

2.1.2. c Evaluation workshop of the SALIENT project in Cameroon, May 5-6, 2023, United Hotel, Mbankomo

Series of activities on mainstreaming gender in SALW in Development Policies were carried out in Cameroon within the implementation of the pilot phase of the SALIENT. A total of 06 capacity building workshops with the civil society and journalists were organised, 01 workshop with Senior Executive Officers from relevant government entities working on the question of SALW, 01 Sensitization workshop with Members of Defence and Security working group of the two houses of Parliament, 01 capacity strengthening of some Staff of UN Agencies and 01 capacity strengthening of Gender Desk Officer On Trauma Healing. Hence to complete the implementation of the SALIENT an evaluation meeting was held with key Stakeholders.

In this light, Key Stakeholders involved in the implementation of the Project in Cameroon which included: MINREX, MINDEF, MINAT, MINJUSTICE, MINPROFF, DGSN, CNDDR, SWISS EMBASSY, UNODA, UNDP, UN WOMEN and CAMYOSFOP through a SWOT Analysis, during an evaluation meeting, assessed the impact of the project and adopted key recommendations on the way forward.

The major outcome of the meeting was the adoption of the draft project document on the sustainability of the SALIENT project in Cameroon which will run for three years.

2.12. d UNSCAR project on: Developing a reporting system for the PoA and the Kinshasa Convention on SALW in Central Africa, September 2022-September 2023

In a bid to regulate the illicit proliferation of arms in Central Africa, CAMYOSFOP in partnership with the UN Trust Facility Supporting Cooperation on Arms Regulation (UNSCAR), implemented a project on Developing a Reporting System for the PoA and the Kinshasa Convention on SALW in Central Africa. Partners of the project included the government of Cameroon through the Ministry of External Relations (MINREX), the Economic Community of Central Africa States (ECCAS) and the UN Office for Peace and Disarmament in Africa (UNREC).



Within the framework of the project, on September 27-29, 2023 at Hotel Franco, Yaounde-Cameroon, twenty-five Representatives from 09 ECCAS countries, (Burundi, Cameroon, Central Africa Republic, Chad, Congo-Brazzaville, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon and Rwanda) were trained on reporting on the PoA and the Kinshasa Convention. The major outcome of the workshop was the adoption of a joint reporting template on the PoA and the Kinshasa Convention on SALW control. In effect, this has helped to strengthen synergies and eliminated duplication in the implementation of the PoA and the Kinshasa convention. In addition, Increased reporting on the two instruments has established an environment auspicious for the development of a Regional Road Map with clear indicators and timelines on reporting on the PoA and the Kinshasa Convention.

2.2. PROGRAM ON ENDING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS

2.2.1. UN WOMEN/CAMYOSFOP project on: “Building protection capacities of women and girls IDPs hosted in 5 municipalities of the west, littoral and centre regions”. June-December 2023

This project was implemented from June to December 2023 in partnership with the Ministry of Women’s Empowerment and the Family, sister UN Agencies, local councils within the framework of decentralization, the civil society organizations (CSOs) and the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). The project targeted vulnerable women and girls, IDPs and host communities in 6 municipalities in three regions, including Babadjou and Dschang in the West region, Loum and Djombe Penja in the Littoral, Bafia and Ombessa in the Centre region.

In order to facilitate the understanding and support of all stakeholders, UN Women organized a start-up workshop with responsible Parties in charge of implementing the project in the field; CAMYOSFOP, ALVF and UYO. The workshop that took place from June 05 to 07, 2023 in Yaounde, permitted the 3 implementing partners to brainstorm on their strategies for a successful achievement of results.

In this light, CAMYOSFOP implemented 14 key activities in Bafia and Ombessa under 2 main outcomes:

Outcome 1: Vulnerable women and girls IDPs and host population are locally supported and live protected in a safe environment

Outcome 2: Vulnerable women IDPs and host population live in health and their dignity restored in a sanitized environment.



KEY RESULTS:

300 IDP women, girls and host communities survivors of GBV have received psychosocial assistance, counselling and about 100 cases followed-up via the coordination of MINPROFF at the Divisional level.

50 leaders of WLOs/WROs from Bafia and Ombessa improved their skills on GBV protection and response and are able to carry out more concrete actions on gender norms for protection of vulnerable women and IDP girls.

50 IDP women, girls and host communities from Bafia and Ombessa, acquired skills on leadership for their protection and increased participation in GBV prevention and response within their communities, as well as build their self-confidence. .

50 Women and Girls acquire knowledge on the Production of Washable Sanitary Pads for a more sustained Menstrual Hygiene Management.

50 participants from groups of WLOs/WROs, as well as IDPs women and girls acquired skills and technics of self-protection, psychological, 1st aid and disaster risk reduction and carry out more concrete actions on gender norms for protection of vulnerable women and IDP girls

40 Mayors and Local Authorities from Bafia, Ombessa, Djombe-Penja, Loum, Dschang and Babajou acquired GBV protection techniques and know how on the management of GBV cases within a humanitarian context.

The municipality of Bafia was supported with the construction of 1 gender hygiene and sanitation facility at the Women Empowerment Centre for improved health in a healthy environment for GBV Survivors.

At least 3000 persons within the host communities of Bafia and Ombessa were sensitised and acquired knowledge on the rights of women and girls and protect them, especially the rights of IDP women and girls, during a moto bike and sports walk sensitization caravan campaign to commemorate the 16 days of activism on ending violence against women and girls in the Mbam and Inoubou Division.

2.3. PROGRAM ON CLIMATE CHANGE AND PROTECTION OF BIODIVERSITY

2.3.1 CAMYOSFOP/Green Grants Fund Project on: Engaging the youths of Mindourou in the protection of their biodiversity and climate change debate'

CAMYOSFOP in partnership with Association Jeunesse Verte du Cameroun (AJVC), sensitized 41 youths from Mindourou in the East region of Cameroon on the importance of preserving and protecting their biodiversity and on issues pertaining to sustainable development. These was achieved during a workshop that took place on April 14th, 2023 at Mindourou where they were engaged on a climate change debate and protection of their biodiversity for a more socially inclusive growth of the youths of the locality and improvement on long-term management of their resources.



2.4. PROMOTING EXEMPLARY FIGURES

2.4.1. Self-implemented activity

2.4.1. a Publication of the unfinished works of Prof. Bernard Nsokika Fonlon

Promoting National Figures has been a key focus of CAMYOSFOP, as the Organization also aims at improving on the moral values of the youths by showcasing Prof. Bernard Fonlon's legacy which includes; the values of, Integrity, honesty, hard work and determination. It is important to highlight the fact that his most outstanding legacy is his unfinished literary works and publications. By promoting this National Figure, CAMYOSFOP hopes to contribute in creating a better version of the Cameroonian youths through whom Fonlon's vision could be traced in both character and career wise.

Prof. Bernard Nsokika Fonlon was a Cameroonian intellectual and philosopher from NSO, who was born in 1924 and died in 1986. He stands out as one of the greatest national figures that contributed to the independence and unity of Cameroon. Some of his achievements include; the translation of the national anthem from French to English, conceived, edited and published

the Cameroon cultural Review, Abbia that harnessed intellectual contributions to sell the image of the country to the rest of the world, he piloted the creation of the Department of African Literature at University of Yaounde, as well as the Pilot Centre for the Promotion of Bilingualism in Cameroon.

Worthy of note is the fact that this program has been ongoing from the very beginning of the Organization's creation as it paves the way for her to contribute in inculcating moral values in the younger generation. As such, in order to achieve a behavioural change, CAMYOSFOP took the commitment of completing the un- finished works of this great mind by publishing his Biographic Legacy.

In this light, the steering committee members in charge of handling the Publication held three coordination meetings on July 1st, July 22nd and August 4th, 2023 at the National Episcopal Centre, Mvoly, Yaounde, where they adopted the writing methodology and equally selected some key national personalities who are going to be recognized during a Partners Dinner/fund raising event that will be organized in honour of Pro. Bernard Fonlon in 2024. Some of the national figures proposed to be recognized during the event included: the former Prime Minister, Philemon Yang, Prof. Dorothy Njeuma, H.E. Abouem A Tchoy and Prof. Rose Leke.

3. OUTCOMES

3.1. CAMYOSFOP BERTOUA OFFICE GOES OPERATIONAL

July 2023 saw the operationalization of the CAMYOSFOP Bertoua Branch Office with a lot of ground work on community and partnership engagement for increased visibility. Concrete actions undertaken include: organization of educative talks with traditional/community leaders and the youths on peace and social cohesion as well as environmental protection and proper management of plastic waste for a healthier environment.

In addition, intensified awareness raising activities on GBV protection and response have been organized a long side some key partners during the 16 days of activism on ending violence against women and girls.

3.2. AWARDS/RECOGNITION

Mr NGALIM Eugene, Executive Director of CAMYOSFOP was recognized for his outstanding contributions in promoting peace by the PCC Peace Office Award for Peace Advocacy in Cameroon.

4. OTHERS

4.1. Level of awareness

CAMYOSFOP engaged the media that is; the Television, Radio and social media to raise awareness on her various programs and activities. The publication of the ‘ VIOCE OF PEACE’ News Letter; 40th edition which focused on civilian protection, 41st edition on promoting the fight against SALW in Central Africa and 42nd on the Second Edition on DCAP intensified the impact of her actions and gave her more visibility at National. Sub-Regional and International levels. This hard work and outstanding achievements thus, earned her a public recognition.
