1. INTRODUCTION

The sudden outbreak of the Corona Virus in 2020 greatly affected the world and its inhabitants economically and particularly made things difficult for Cameroon as the country already deals with cases of gun and physical violence, in the Anglophone regions, Northern and eastern regions. CAMYOSFOP faced great challenges in executing her activities as the pandemic constrained countries, with Cameroon being no exception to implement strict preventive measures. Bars, petty businesses, enterprises and other recreational areas were given a curfew, a ban was placed on crowds containing more than 50 people, and schools were shut down.

Due to this, CAMYSOFOP had to postpone most of her events and projects which had been engaged in 2019. One in particular focused on building the capacity of youth in secondary schools through the Human Rights, Peace and SDGs Clubs. The outbreak of the pandemic triggered the suspension of all club activities including the cultural manifestation which had already been programmed to take place in March 2020 and the completion of the UNSCAR project.

None the less, the Organization was able to implement two projects, carried a study for the CPDE Youth Constituency between June and December and also participated in a series of online meetings/webinar.

2. COVID-19 RESPONSE

CAMYOSFOP in her response to the COVID-19 pandemic developed strategies to continue functioning while respecting Government preventive measures that was put in place to fight against the pandemic. The Organization equipped herself with protective kits that were put at the disposal of staff. Working from home via online meetings and webinars was encouraged. As one of the Youth leading NGOs in Cameroon, the Organization received protective and sanitary kits from UN Women for distribution to youth's groups thus contributing to the government effort to curb the spread of the Corona virus.

3. CO- SPONSORED ACTIVITY

a. CAPACITY STRENGTHENING OF CAMYOSFOP STAFF ON GUIDELINES OF IMPLEMENTATION OF UN WOMEN PROJECTS, FACILITATED BY UN WOMEN COUNTRY OFFICE, YAOUNDE, AUGUST 2020

Prior to the implementation of the project, CAMYOSFOP staff was invited by UN Women for a capacity building on key guideline courses on the working relation with UN Women and interaction of beneficiaries of UN Women projects. The training courses that included results based reporting, ethics and integrity and prevention of sexual harassment/abuse of authority within the work environment also saw the participation of the representatives of the Cameroon Network of Adolescents and Positive Youth (RECAJ+), a partner network to CAMYOSFOP.

b. ADVOCACY WORKSHOP ON MOBILIZING KEY NATIONAL STAKEHOLDERS ON THE RATIFICATION OF THE TREATY ON THE PROHIBITION OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS BY CAMEROON, AUGUST 6, 2020, YAOUNDE

As part of the commemoration of the Hiroshima Atomic bombing of 6th August 1945, Women International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF) in partnership with CAMYOSFOP and with the support of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN) organized a sensitization workshop in Yaounde to mobilize the Cameroonian government on the need for the ratification of the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW).



At the end of the workshop, the following recommendations were adopted:

- Intensify awareness raising programs regarding the treaty and the dangers of nuclear weapons with key stakeholders and the general public

- Strengthen capacity of key stakeholder on the TPNW
- Intensify advocacy programs with key actors like parliamentarians, key government ministries, CSOs.
- Organize meetings with inter-ministerial committee in charge of ratifying international instrument/treaties

4. SPONSORED ACTIVITIES

a. CAMYOSFO PROJECT ON: THE FIGHT AGAINST THE STIGMATIZATION OF HIV/AIDS AMID THE COVID-19 WITHIN THE MBORORO, PYGMY, YOUTH AND WOMEN LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS IN THE EAST, LITTORAL, WEST AND SOUTH WEST REGIONS OF CAMEROON

CAMYOSFOP received funding from UN Women UBBRAF to implement the outputs of this project for a period of 5 months. The project tackles stigmatization of HIV/AIDS and Covid_19 within the indigenous and vulnerable groups in three regions of Cameroon. Due to limited information on prevention and management of the two pandemics, these groups of people are at risk of contracting these diseases coupled with their economic situation that complicates the sustainability of their livelihood and treatment. The project focused on capacity building, economic empowerment, psychosocial support and awareness raising activities.

i. INCEPTION MEETING WITH KEY LEADERS OF THE MBORORO AND PYGMY COMMUNITIES; AUGUST 2020, BERTOUA

7 key leaders of the Mbororo and pygmy communities (2 women and 5 men) of the East Region, were briefed on the UN Women/CAMYOSFOP project on; the fight against the stigmatization of HIV/AIDS amid the COVID 19 within the Mbororo, Pygmy, Youth and Women living with HIV/AIDS in the East, Littoral, West and South West Regions of Cameroon, during an inception meeting that was organized by CAMYOSFOP on Thursday 27th August, 2020 in Bertoua. The objective of the meeting was to present the project to the benefiting communities, as well as identifying their roles in the implementation of the project and also to distribute the COVID 19 prevention kits received from UN Women.

ii. CAPACITY BUILDING MEETING TO ESTABLISH THE NETWORK OF YOUNG PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV IN THE WEST AND LITTORAL REGIONS TO IMPROVE ADHERENCE AND RETENTION

CAMYOSFOP in partnership with the *Reseau Camerounais des Jeunes Positifs* (ReCAJ+), also known in English as “Cameroon Network of Positive Youth and Adolescents organized two training workshops on the 8–9 and 11–12 of September 2020, with 30 adolescents; 15 from the Littoral and 15 from the West regions respectively. Young people living with HIV in the Littoral and West Regions were educated and gained Knowledge on how to cater for their wellbeing and create awareness against the Stigmatization of people living with HIV. The objective of these workshops was to build the capacities of regional executives for better administrative, human and financial management of the organization and integrate

the regional branches into the local HIV/AIDS response environment as well as officially set up the RECAJ+ branches of the Littoral and West Regions.

At the end of the meeting, the Littoral and West branches were officially set up with their pilot executives.

The following were also recommended;

- Stakeholders should work with ReCAJ+ to ensure the psychosocial well-being of children, adolescents, and young adults living with HIV
- A permanent framework for identifying and solving the specific problems of children, adolescents and young adults living with HIV should be created.
- UN Women should support ReCAJ+ to create more awareness and reduce the number of AIDS deaths among adolescents, children and young people living with HIV to zero by 2035.

iii. CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP OF WOMEN LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS ON MICRO FINANCE AND PROJECTS MANAGEMENT, SEPTEMBER 12, 2020, BUEA

Twenty-one participants (20 women and 1 man) drawn from 4 groups of women living with HIV in the South West Region acquired knowledge on Micro Finance and Project Management during a capacity strengthening workshop organized by CAMYOSFOP on the 12 of September 2020 in Buea.

The workshop equipped project beneficiaries with key notions and tools on finance and project management as well as, provision of financial assistance by CAMYOSFOP to run their micro projects to sustainably support their livelihood and treatment. At the end of the training their micro projects on purchase of chairs for rentals was funded by CAMYOSFOP

iv. CAPACITY STRENGTHENING WORKSHOP OF MBORORO AND BAKA WOMEN ON MICRO FINANCE AND PROJECTS MANAGEMENT, 16 – 18 SEPTEMBER 2020, IN MANDJOU AND MMAYOS

30 women from the Mbororo and Pygmy communities of the East Region were empowered on Micro Finance and Project Management during capacity building workshops held in the Mbororo community in Mandjou and the Baka Pygmy community in Mayos from 16 - 18 September 2020. The workshop objective was to equip project beneficiaries with key notions and tools on finance and project management as well as, providing them with financial assistance to run their micro projects to sustainably support their livelihood and treatment. The training permitted the two groups to acquire knowledge on: basic notions of book keeping; use of financial tools for informed decision making processes; and how to undertake a need assessment in the development of a micro project

Two micro projects were selected and funded by CAMYOSFOP at the end of training were a provision store for the Baka ladies and purchase of catering equipment for the Mbororos women group.

v. CARAVAN TO RAISE AWARENESS ON THE FIGHT AGAINST HIV/AIDS STIGMA AND GENDER BASED VIOLENCE AMID COVID-19, 19 - 21 NOVEMBER 2020, BERTOUA

2 caravans were organized by CAMYOSFOP to sensitize women, men and the youths against the stigmatization of HIV/AIDS amid Covid-19 in the Mbororo and Pygmy communities of Mandjou and Mayos, East Region of Cameroon. Activities during the caravan included; a march pass, talks, quiz, musical animation and psycho-social consultations to the populations of the target communities. Enormous awareness was raised through community sanitization and media outreach programs and about 100 Mbororo and Pygmy Women Living with HIV/AIDS received psychosocial support.



vi. CAPACITY BUILDING OF HEALTH WORKERS ON IMPROVED SERVICE DELIVERY ON HIV/AIDS BASED ON HUMAN RIGHTS APPROACH; 8-10 DECEMBER 2020, BAFOUSSAM

40 Community Health workers were empowered for effective and efficient service delivery to Persons living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHIV) during a capacity strengthening workshop organized by CAMYOSFOP in partnership with UN Women from 8-10 December 2020 in Bafoussam with participants coming from Yaounde, Tiko, Douala, Bertoua and Bafoussam.

During the 3 days workshop, participants developed strategies to optimize service delivery to PLWHIV after experience sharing given that they had become more conscious of their roles as Community Health Workers and committed to implement the resolutions that came out, thus contributing to ending GBV, discrimination and stigmatization.

b. AFRICA UNION/ UNITED NATIONS JOINT SUPPORT FOR THE SEPTEMBER 2020 AFRICA AMNESTY MONTH; AUGUST – DECEMBER 2020

In the framework of the African Union’s “Silencing the Guns in Africa by 2020” initiative, countries of the African Union (AU) committed to declare the month of September (until 2020): “Africa Amnesty Month”. The initiative in 2020 was marked by the September 2020 Africa Amnesty Month project (SeptAAM2020), jointly supported for a one-year period by the African Union Commission (AUC) and the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs (UNODA), as from March 2020.

In view of marking the celebration of the 2020 Amnesty Month in Cameroon, CAMYOSFOP in partnership with MINREX implemented a number of activities which included;

i. TRAINING ON PHYSICAL SECURITY, STOCK MANAGEMENT (PSSM) OF WEAPONS, 16-17 OCTOBER 2020, YOAUNDE

25 participants drawn from relevant government departments and the civil society exchanged and discussed on stockpile management of small arms and light weapons in Central Africa during a two day training that took place at the International Relation Institute of Cameroon (IRIC) in Yaounde. With the facilitation of UNODA and RECSA, participants exchanged on ; the International Ammunition Training Guidelines (IATG) and the Modular Small Arms Control Implementation Compendium (MOSAIC); Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW) marking and tracing; ammunition storage, marking and painting; Arms and Security (External and Internal); Transportation of arms and ammunition; Inventory management; Stockpile elimination; and MANPAD threat.



ii. LAUNCH OF THE 2020 SEPTEMBER AFRICA AMNESTY MONTH, 19 OCTOBER 2020, YOAUNDE

The official launch commemorating celebrations of the 2020 September Amnesty Month took place at Hilton Hotel and brought together stakeholders from Government Institutions, Ministries, Diplomatic Corps, International and local NGOs. The event that was officiated by MINREX had as main objective to sensitize key stakeholders and the general public on Cameroon's engagement as well as the various activities to be implemented. Officially launching the Amnesty Month, H.E. Lejeune MBELLA MBELLA, Minister of External Relations reiterated the Head of State Policy of Cameroon piloting the promotion of peace, security and the stability of Central Africa through the fight against SALW. The Executive Secretary of RECSA, General Bedraldin Elamin as well as the Representative of the UN Office for Disarmament Affairs, Dr Ivor Richard FUNG Praised Cameroon for taking the lead in Central Africa in the implementation of key UN and Regional instruments on SALW and pledged to continuously supporting Cameroon's efforts.



iii. TRAINING ON COMMUNITY POLICING, 20 OCTOBER 2020, YOAUNDE

25 police officer acquired Knowledge on the Concept of Community Policing during a two days training that was organized at the advanced police school in Yaounde. Preliminary stage focused on preparatory meetings to identify, select participants and resources persons, after which training agenda, content were adopted. Through plenary presentations, discussions, experience sharing and question and answer sessions, participants were drilled on; the Key role of community policing in the fight against illicit proliferation of small arms and light weapons; the activities and task of Police Officers in the functioning of Community Policing; the Benefits of Implementing Community-Oriented Policing and how to develop capacities for

Community Policing. A key outcome from this workshop is the commitment of the Police to include Community Policing in the training curricula of Police in Cameroon.

iv. SENSITIZATION OF TRADITIONAL LEADERS AND BLACKSMITHS ON THE 2016 WEAPONS REGULATION LAW, 24 NOVEMBER AND 17 DECEMBER, 2020, IN BAMENDA AND MAROUA

This activity brought together 25 traditional leaders and blacksmiths from the North West Region and same number from the Far North Region who were sensitized on the Cameroon gun law of 2016. During the sensitization meeting, experiences were shared on insecurity cases and discussions made on the consequences of arms trafficking and their impacts on the society.

Key presentations including the concept of Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW), causes and consequences of the illicit proliferation of SALW; Overview of Law No 2016/015 of 14 December 2016 on arms and ammunition in Cameroon with focus on the production, sells, holding and use of firearms and legal procedure and sanctions as well as the functioning of the National Commission on Disarmament, Demobilization and Reinsertion (DDR) made it possible to get a clue of communities' perspective on security issues and the illicit proliferation of SALW in both regions. In that respect, a number of ideas were developed in discussions around the causes and the consequences of the patterns of security issues existing in Cameroon (the conflict situation in the North-West and South-West Regions, the Boko-Haram insurgency in the Far North and the importation of insecurity through the flow of refugees from a neighbouring war-torn country in the East Region). The traditional leaders therefore took the commitment of engaging their communities more in the fight against the illicit proliferation of SALW, encouraging them to hand

over illegal weapons in their possession and engaging both women and youth in peace processes in their communities.

v. SENSITIZATION WORKSHOPS ON THE ROLE OF WOMEN AND THE YOUTH IN THE FIGHT AGAINST SALW AND ARMS COLLECTION, 25 NOVEMBER AND 18 DECEMBER, 2020, IN BAMENDA MAROUA

25 women and youth leaders from the North West Region and the same configuration from the Far North Region were sensitized on the role of women and

youth in the fight against the illicit proliferation of SALW. Discussions during this meeting centre on: the causes and consequences of SALW in Cameroon, a snapshot of the various conflicts affecting Cameroon and the role of women in peace processes through the UN Security Council Resolution 1325 on women peace and security. The discussions permitted the participants to commit themselves in greater involvement in the fight against SALW and taking the lead in the ongoing peace processes in Cameroon.

vi. SENSITIZATION CARAVANS ON VOLUNTARY HANDING OF ILLICIT WEAPONS, 19 DECEMBER AND 23 DECEMBER IN MAROUA AND BERTOUA

Local sensitization was conducted through the organization of two Peace caravans on Silencing the Gun and the voluntary handing of illicit weapons in Maroua and Bertoua. The events were officially launched by Secretary Generals of the Far North and East Regions. Both officials calls for the individuals illegally holding weapons to voluntarily hand them and benefit from the AU amnesty freeing them from any persecution by the government. Other activities included sensitization marches across the two cities, presentations/speeches, traditional dances, poems and performances of local Artists. Weapons collected during this period will be publicly destroyed in May 2021. It is worthy of note that the events were highly mediatised.



5. UNSCAR PROJECT ON CAPACITY BUILDING OF 11 MEMBER STATES OF ECCAS ON DATA COLLECTION OF SDG TARGET 16.4.2 ON SMALL ARMS AND LIGHT WEAPONS (SALW) AND THE APPLICATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRACING INSTRUMENT (ITI).

CAMYOSFOP in a bid to regulate the illicit proliferation of arms in Central Africa received funding from the UN Trust Facility Supporting Cooperation on Arms Regulation (UNSCAR) , to implement this project on data collection of SDG target 16.4.2. In partnership with the Ministry of External Relations (MINREX) and the Economic Community of Central Africa States (ECCAS), the 11 Member States ECCAS will be trained on data collection of SDG 16.4.2 on SALW and ITI culminating to an analytic report on the situation of SALW in Central Africa. The 11 member states are: Angola, Burundi, Cameroon, Central Africa Republic, Equatorial Guinea, Chad, Congo Brazzaville, Gabon, Sao Tome and Principe and Rwanda

The first phase of this project has been on developing the training guide and tools for data collection by a Consultant. This ended with a validation meeting of the training guide and tools for data collection by Experts in the domain of arms control drawn from relevant government entities and the civil society held in Yaounde on December 5, 2020.

6. CONSULTANCIES:

a. CONSULTANCY ON EVIDENCING EFFECTIVE DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION PRINCIPLE IN COVID-19 RESPONSE AND THE IMPACTS ON YOUTH AND YOUTH ORGANIZATIONS

CAMYOSFOP in partnership with the CPDE Youth Constituency in October 2020 initiated a study on evidencing effective development cooperation (EDC) principles in COVID-19 response and the impact on youth and youth organizations in Cameroon.

The goal of the survey was to assess the impact of COVID-19 on youth activism, employment and growth upon appraising the Busan Principles. The data gathering process covered 5 EDC principles; Socio-economic, ownership, Inclusive partnership, Human Rights at the core of the pandemic response and CSOs good practices in leveraging EDC in COVID-19 response.

Data was collected through primary and secondary sources. 100 questionnaires were administered in the 10 regions of Cameroon. Category of respondents included; Youth CSOs, Young Civil Servants, young Entrepreneurs, workers in the private sector and students.

Results from the survey highlighted severe economic impact of the COVID-19 on young people in Cameroon thus the need for development actors to strengthen the implementation of the EDC principles in order to make development outcome more sustainable.

7. RECOGNITIONS

In 2020 CAMYOSFOP was recognized for her work with two Awards from the GAICAM Achievement Award with the Executive Director of CAMYOSFOP as the Impact Peace Advocate for 2020 and the Guardian Post Award with CAMYOSFOP as the most outstanding campaigner on the fight against arms flow in Cameroon in 2020.



8. PARTNERSHIP ENGAGEMENTS:

In 2020 CAMYOSFOP held discussions with the following partners to forge greater collaboration in program execution:

1. Ministry of Secondary Education (MINESEC) on the implementation of Human Rights Education in secondary schools.
2. UNICEF, on greater collaboration in the implementation of human rights education and inclusive education in Cameroon's primary and secondary schools.
3. Regional Centre on Small Arms in the Great Lakes and the Horn of Africa (RECSEA) on greater collaboration on arms control in Central Africa.
4. Swiss Embassy in Yaounde, on greater collaboration on strengthening the role of civil society in the promotion of peace, security and the stability of Cameroon.
5. European Union Commission in Yaounde, on greater collaboration in the CAMYOSFOP arms control program in Cameroon.
